Participants will receive a special behind the scenes tour through Ahihi Kinau Natural Area Reserve, one of 2 of Hawaii's only natural area reserves with the marine component. A ranger will lead a hike through the reserve and participants will learn about management issues balancing use vs. conservation and education and have the opportunity to snorkel in a pristine area.

Learn to use the Reef Environmental Education Foundation (REEF) survey which allows volunteers to collect and report information on marine fish populations using the roving diver technique. The data is housed in a publicly accessible database on REEF's Website. This data can be used by resource agencies to affect management decisions. This will be a fun interactive way to explore Hawaiian reef communities and learn about our unique ecosystem. Join Fish enthusiast Liz Foote with Coral Reef Alliance as she hosts this REEF survey.

Maluaka is located just in front of the Maui Prince Hotel. 5400 Makena Alanui, Makena, HI. Participants should NOT park in hotel parking. The parking for Maluaka Beach is just past the turn in to the Maui Prince. Turn right on the very next street after the Maui prince; Park in the parking lot and walk down to the beach. The group will be located on the grassy area near the public bathrooms and showers overlooking the ocean. There will be a big REEF sign – can't miss it.

Liz Foote

Liz is the Hawaii Field Manager for the Coral Reef Alliance (CORAL), and the founder and Executive Director of Project S.E.A.-Link. Liz received her B.S. in Ecology, Behavior & Evolution from the University of California, San Diego, and her M.S. in Science Education/Marine Science from Oregon State University. She currently coordinates several collaborative marine science and education efforts on Maui which include community-based reef monitoring, development of education & outreach tools and strategies, K-12 experiential education, and methods to promote sustainable marine tourism. She has lived on Maui since 1998, and prior to her current efforts she worked as a crewmember and naturalist on snorkel and whale watch vessels; and also held jobs as a kayak quide, an underwater videographer, and a substitute teacher in Maui's schools.
